Work for Peace

I am inspired to work hard for peace, especially in the higher education sector where I serve as Commissioner of the Philippine Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and I want to enjoin all of you to involve yourselves in peace-making and peace-building initiatives in your respective communities and countries.

And true enough, in 2019, we approved the issuance of a mandate directing all higher education institutions in the country to adopt the integration of Peace Studies into the higher education curricula.) Thus, the role of education (or higher education) as an effective tool for peace.

I'd like to impress upon all of you today the motivation and the reason, or shall I say, the "inspiration" why Peace Studies in higher education was adopted.

The reason is to ensure that our country's educational institutions can become effective instruments for the propagation of world peace, therefore, all Filipino students shall enroll themselves in peace subjects or courses that carry key peace themes and perspectives.

- How I wish that all peoples around the world, through the collaboration and guidance of the HWPL under our dear Chairman Man Hee Lee, will be educated, trained, and inculcated the values of peace, respect, harmony, and solidarity with all peoples and humankind.
- As my quote goes, "Investing in peace is investing for the future". How I wish that all governments around the world will invest more in peace and adopt the DPCW (Declaration of Peace and Cessation of War) and emphasize the role of nation-states and civil society in achieving peace.

Further, in relation to education as tool for peace, and being the only Filipino awardee of the prestigious Mahatma MK Gandhi Prize for Non-Violent Peace Award for 2020 (Thanks so much to HWPL thru Chair Man Hee Lee for the nomination), I am more committed to peace work and more peace work, especially in raising the call among all of you and all peoples of the world to volunteer for peace by becoming International Volunteer Individuals for Peace(I-VIP) and HWPL who will work for world peace, understanding, harmony and unity. This is the primary objective of our peace organizations: The Volunteer Individuals for Peace (VIP), and HWPL.

Now, I'd like to conclude by saying that in the Philippines, we are tirelessly engaged in various peace-related activities and extracurricular programs via our government's peace education programs like:

- The establishment of Volunteer Individuals for Peace (VIP) in partnership with Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL) Peace Monuments and Peace Markers in state universities and colleges; and a resolution no. 262-2023 passed by CHED enjoining all Philippine Higher Education Institutions and CHED Central and Regional Offices to permanently designate in their libraries "Peace Corners" That will be devoted solely for the Promotion of Peace;
- Establishment of VIP-HWPL (Volunteer Individuals for Peace-Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light) Student Peace Clubs in state universities and colleges;
- Organizing of on-the-spot painting contest for peace, peace music fests in state universities and colleges to highlight the relevance of peace in nation-building and youth development;
- Organizing peace literary competition, peace essay writing competition, peace songwriting like "We Are One."
- Publication of the books on peace and indigenous peoples' rights.
- Film promotion in state universities and colleges of the values-packed, historical-cultural, and peace-themed movies.



• Declaration of National Peace Day (January 24) of every year in the Philippines.

Lastly, to our dear HWPL Chairman Man Hee Lee, friends and fellow international peace advocates I'd say: All of these initiatives are envisioned to increase and sustain peace among peoples and nations of the world, through education!

Finally, I leave with you 2 of my quotes: "Let's declare peace as pandemic, infect people not to rest in peace, but to live in peace." And, "Education is a way to peace and a stairway to a better future."
